Demonstrates compliance with oral buprenorphine therapy as documented by a recent urine drug screen testing for licit and illicit drugs with the potential for abuse (including specific testing for oxycodone, fentanyl, tramadol, and carisoprodol) that is both of the following: a) Positive for buprenorphine and norbuprenorphine b) Consistent with prescribed controlled substances. What is opioid agonist therapy? Opioid agonist therapy (OAT) is an effective treatment for addiction to opioid drugs such as heroin, oxycodone, hydromorphone (Dilaudid), fentanyl and Percocet. The therapy involves taking the opioid agonists methadone (Methadose) or buprenorphine (Suboxone). These medications work to prevent withdrawal and reduce
