EXAMPLES OF READING MEASURABLE GOALS Grade \_\_, J will read it aloud at \_\_\_ words correct per minute 80% of the time In 2 out of 4 opportunities After hearing a Grade \_\_ story read aloud/using a text reader, J will retell the story including: setting, character/s, problem/s, event/s,

and resolution with a score of 3, or better, on a 5 point rubric 85% of the time 75% of the time Over 5

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### **Standards Based IEP Goals**
