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25 Common Nursing Home Problems—

The Medicare program, by contrast, pays for nursing home care for only a limited period of time At most, Medicare can pay for only 100 days of nursing home care per benefit period A new benefit period starts when the Medicare beneficiary has not received Medicare-covered inpatient care in a nursing home or hospital for at least 60 days
